For drip-free guns, the mechanism should handle this, but ensure it's functioning correctly. Sometimes, simply pulling the plunger rod back slightly after releasing the trigger can help relieve residual pressure on older or less expensive guns.

Uneven Beads: Consistency is Key

This usually stems from inconsistent trigger pressure or irregular movement. Practice on a scrap piece of material to synchronize your squeezing and moving. Consider using a drip-free caulk gun to eliminate one variable.

Caulk Not Coming Out: Blockages and Other Issues
