4. The screenshot will be saved to your desktop.

4. Using the Screenshot App (macOS Mojave and later)

macOS Mojave and subsequent versions introduced a dedicated Screenshot app, accessible via a new shortcut.

Steps:

1. Press **Shift + Command + 5**.
2. A control bar will appear at the bottom of your screen, offering options to capture the entire screen, a selected window, or a selected portion. You can also choose to record

your screen.

3. Click "Options" to set a timer or choose where to save your screenshots.
4. Click "Capture" to take the screenshot.
