The ring, though still in his possession, is now less a symbol of temptation and more a reminder of his extraordinary journey and the courage he discovered within himself.

Upon his return, Bilbo finds that he has been presumed dead and his belongings are being auctioned off. His homecoming is met with amusement and suspicion by his fellow hobbits, who cannot comprehend his tales of adventure. However, Bilbo Baggins is forever changed. He has seen the world, faced his fears, and discovered a deep well of courage and resourcefulness.
