My baby won't drink stored breast milk. What can I do?

Some babies are sensitive to the taste of milk with high lipase activity. If this is the case, and after consulting with a lactation consultant, you might consider scalding the milk before freezing. Alternatively, try offering the milk at a different temperature or in a different type of bottle. Sometimes, the difference in temperature or the order in which milk is offered can make a difference.

Can I combine milk from different days?

Yes, you can combine milk from different pumping sessions on the same day, as long as you cool the fresh milk before adding it to previously chilled milk. However, for longer-term storage, it's generally best to store milk from each pumping session separately until it's all cooled, then combine them into a single container for freezing, labeling with the oldest date.

Do not combine milk from different days in the refrigerator unless you are using it within the 4-day guideline.
